The Orlando Convention starts right off on Thursday night with a “Welcome to Orlando Family Beach Party” featuring a live band, **the Beu Sisters**, who are perhaps best known for their work for The Disney Channel. Born into a musical family, Candice, Christie and Danielle Beu were encouraged by their parents, Broadway veterans, to develop their talents. As singers and songwriters, the sisters are known for numerous movie and television soundtracks, including “The Lizzie McGuire Movie Soundtrack,” “Ella Enchanted,” “Smallville,” “Buffy the Vampire Slayer,” “Gilmore Girls,” and “Charmed.” They quickly became a Disney fan favorite and were featured at the Hollywood Bowl in “Disneymania II In Concert” and Disney albums too numerous to list. Then they expanded their fan base by opening for “American Idol” Alums Kelly Clarkson and Clay Aiken on tour.

Now on their own label, Beach Breakz Records, this Florida family has written, arranged, produced, and recorded all of their songs entitled “A Collection of Beu-tiful Music.” In this diverse collection, the Beu Sisters offer a variety of musical entrées to satisfy a variety of musical tastes.

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## **MIAMI DOLPHINS ADD MAALOUF TO STAFF**

The Miami Dolphins have named Marwan Maalouf as their assistant special teams coach. Maalouf joins the Dolphins after spending the 2012 season as the Special Teams coordinator with the Indianapolis Colts. During the 2012 season Colts punter Pat McAfee finished third in the AFC and fifth in the NFL in punting average with a 47.9 per punt average. McAfee, who also handled the kickoff duties for Indianapolis finished fourth in the AFC and eighth in the NFL with 43 touchbacks on kickoffs.

Prior to joining the Colts, Maalouf spent four seasons (2008-11) as the assistant special teams coach for the Baltimore Ravens. In 2010, Maalouf helped then rookie kickoff returner David Reed lead the NFL in kickoff return average (29.2) and coached a unit which finished third in the league in opponent average starting position (27.2-yard line). Kicker Billy Cundiff also earned his first Pro Bowl after tying an NFL mark with 40 touchbacks (since kickoffs moved back to the 30-yard line).

In 2009, Baltimore ranked second in the NFL in both kickoff return average (26.3) and opponents’ average starting field position (26.9). Maalouf joined the Ravens in 2008 and that season coached punter Sam Koch, who had the NFL’s fifth-best net punting average (39.9). Koch also led the league with 18 punts inside the 10-yard line and was second in the league with 34 kicks inside the 20-yard line. Maalouf also helped guide special teams ace Brendon Ayanbadejo to his third Pro Bowl selection.

Maalouf spent the 2007 season working for Scouts Inc., writing weekly scouting reports and game reviews for ESPN.com.

From 2004-06, Maalouf was the special teams quality control coach for the Cleveland Browns. During his final season, he coached Josh Cribbs who ranked third in the NFL with 1,545 total return yards. The Browns’ punt return average of 10.3 yards also ranked seventh in the NFL.

Maalouf spent two seasons (2002-03) as an assistant offensive line coach/graduate assistant at Rutgers following a brief stint at Eastern Michigan as a graduate assistant. He also held positions as an assistant offensive line coach for Fordham (2001) and Baldwin-Wallace College (2000).

There is also Camp Dolphin that is a supervised activity center for kids ages 4-12. The hotel has gift shops, newsstands, an ATM, and laundry facilities. The theme park shuttle is complimentary and runs every 10-15 minutes.


